101st Signal Battalion

The 101st Signal Battalion is living the world of 21st century transformation and we have exciting changes and many challenges ahead during the next three years.

In January the Battalion was tasked to make another technology transformation in less than nine months. Two years ago the Battalion was scheduled to transition into an Integrated Theater Signal Battalion (ITSB) during the FY 2007 training year. However, changes in technology and battlefield requirements have required a strategy shift and accelerated our fielding. The 101st Signal Battalion will be fielding and transitioning into a new designated organization know as an Expeditionary Signal Battalion (ESB) during this training year. We will continue this effort during the next three years until we field our new TACSAT, Video Conferencing, upgraded Switches, LOS's and JNN.

The Battalion staff is preparing implementation plans and will be briefing key leaders during the April drill. Let me summarize this significant shift, which will enable you to comprehend the impact this change will have on training and readiness. The Battalion will be turning in nearly all of our current communications rolling stock and will be re-fielding new equipment during this years AT exercise. This requires us to focus our training attention on preparing our current equipment for turn-in, preparing to receive new equipment and new equipment training for operators. We have relocated this year's Annual Training location to Ft. Drum, New York.

The 101st new communications network ability and applications will be as mobile as the forces we are required to support. Today's Commanders and leaders require battle command and battle space awareness delivered in real-time data operating under adverse and dispersed conditions. At the lower tactical echelons, commanders and their staffs must be able to move with the same mobility as their Soldiers while performing their battle command functions.

The transformation of the Signal Regiment and the 101st Battalion's role is a subset of the Army's overall changes to become more lethal, deployable, and decentralized in fighting the current war on terrorism. The Signal Regiment transformation moves from the legacy network designed to fight the cold war to a decentralized and net-centric environment. The transformation brings the power of the United States strategic infrastructure to the forefront of the battlefield. Corps, Divisions, brigade combat teams (BCTs), and support brigades decentralizes signal capabilities, with signal forces now organic to the BCTs and brigades, owned, operated, trained and maintained by the BCT. Supporting the commander with reliable and redundant communications is a direct result of detailed planning.

We signalers are tasked with great responsibility to facilitate the combined arms, joint, and coalition fight. This mission is critical to increasing the combat power in the modular force. Our new equipment, networks and skills will provide battlefield commanders and Soldiers with timely and situational awareness. 101st Signal Battalion's destiny is to play a critical role in enabling combat successes and prevailing over the Global War on Terrorism.
