

A Message From The President **MG Joseph P. O'Leary (Ret)**



On Friday 13 Nov 09 a retirement party was held in the National Guard Headquarters building in Latham, NY. Honoring COL Dan Travers. He has been a strong supporter of signal operations and training in the NYARNG for many years, and is a long time member of the Liberty Chapter SCRA.

His last assignment was as J6, Joint Task Force Headquarters. In May 2004 COL Travers was mobilized with the 42nd Infantry Division where he served as the division G6. The Division was deployed to Iraq in support of "Operation Iraqi Freedom". As G6 COL Travers was responsible for the management and oversight of the communication system serving the 42nd in combat, both internally and connecting them into the world wide network.

He utilized the personnel and equipment of two signal battalions, one National Guard, and one Active Component, and sections from a satellite company and other signal organizations. Using two different vintages of MSE, JNN, and COTs were integrated into the signal system to support the Division. This was the first time that JNN had been deployed in a combat theater and integrated with MSE.

COL Travers was ably assisted in managing this highly successful system by LTC Greg Dreisbach current commander of the 101st Signal Battalion and the Division communications Sergeant Major, SGM Paul J. Higgitt Jr. Col Travers will be sorely missed in the NY National Guard not only for his signal expertise, but for his professional leadership qualities and his ability to motivate soldiers, officers and enlisted, to get the best results. The National Guard in New York is a better organization for his having served in it.

On the next day, Saturday, a retirement party was held at the 42nd ID Headquarters in Troy NY to honor SGM P.J. Higgitt Jr. for his over 30 years of service. SGM Higgitt, a Liberty chapter member, served with COL Travers and LTC Dreisbach in the G6 Section of the 42nd ID in Iraq. The SGM's last assignment was J6 Communications Sergeant Major, Joint Forces Headquarters, Latham, NY. SGM Higgitt received many civilian and military awards, one


