Greacian Firebolt 06 (GF-06) Annual Training Exercises provided the 101st Signal Battalion (-) a real opportunity to deliver telecommunications services to the 154th Quartermaster Battalion QLLEX customers. From 10-24 June 2006 the 101st Signal Battalion conducted annual training exercises at Devens RFTA in MA.

The 154th QM Bn out of Pittsburgh PA was undergoing an ARTEP evaluation on fuel and petroleum delivery services. The support provided to QLLEX customers included OPFOR insurgent probing led by 1LT Chad Payne who is the 101st Signal Battalion S-2.

GF-06 was noted for many significant achievements by the Battalion and it's staff, not the least of which is the ability of CPT Matt Bayless to deploy the C Company AN/TTC 56 SSS Switch to Fort McCoy Wisconsin in

support of the Patriot Warrior Exercises. The Patriot Warrior exercise was focused on interoperability and Homeland Security. 1SG Vautrin of C Co and SPC Scott of A Company accompanied the SSS to Wisconsin and the equipment supported the Commanding General of the 88th RRC who is MG Robert A Pollman.

As a result of exceptional equipment maintenance, training rehearsals, contingency planning and team work, the 101st Signal Battalion exceeded minimum expectations of customer service to the 154th QM Bn at Devens RFTA. A significant milestone for the data team was establishing the promina data package in loop back in preparation to provide NIPRNET service for the QLLEX exercises. The promina data package was fielded by NGB in the summer of 2005. Though the TAC/SAT provided by the 311th fell short of expectations, the data team worked tirelessly to overcome their learning curve on the new equipment in the data package.

Co A 101st Sig Bn transitioned from Field Artillary in 2003 and at GF-06 the AN/TTC Switch Operator came from the A Company ranks. SGT Drayer successfully provided a DCO drop into the SSS to provide commercial telecommunications access to QLLEX customers in the field as well as DNVT and DSVT tactical phone services. In addition, the 25F team successfully programmed the SSS to allow conference-calling capability between key staff of the 101st Signal Battalion and the 154th Quartermaster Battalion. 1LT Darren Ketchum, A Company Commander served as the Battle Captain in the Battalion control element (BATCON). In addition, A Company provided 25Q's to supplement staff on the B Company LOS team. GF-06 fully demonstrated how far A Company has come in its transition from Field Artillary to Signal.

Co B 101st Sig Bn provided the Mission Commander and the 25Q Line of Sight Radio team to extend services from the Devens RFTA Contollment area to the QLLEX field site. 1LT Peter Villahos lead his team with unparalled professionalism. It was his first shot in a command role and he folded together soldiers from all units in the Battalion into a real communications team. B Company also provided Driver training and HHC coordinated a Combat Lifesaver Course which certified 29 soldiers as Combat Lifesavers. This meets the 10% requirement of the Battalions strength to be certified Combat Lifesavers.

Grecian Firebolt 06 is behind the Battalion but the year ahead promises continued excitement and growth as we plan the transition from an Echelon Above Corps (EAC) Signal Battalion to an Integrated Theatre Signal Battalion (ITSB). Watch for future details on the transition in later editions of the Liberty Chapter newsletter.

As a result of the exceptional service provided to the 154th QM Bn at Devens RFTA, LTC Buggy presented LTC Russell a Liberty Bell trophy at the conclusion of the GF-06 and QLLEX annual training exercises. Please help to extend your congratulations to LTC Russell and her staff for the many significant achievements that have been accomplished since the Battalion stood up in September of 2004. If the first two years is any indication of what is to come, we can only continue to expect great things from the Battalion as it stands ready to respond on a moments notice to any event which requires its service.
