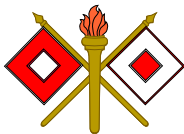

A Message From The President MG Joseph P. O'Leary (Ret)



The National Guard Association of the US (NGAUS) Conducted its 130th general conference in Baltimore From 20 thru 22 Sep 08. Approximately 4,000 Members of the National Guard (Including 47 from New York) and their families attended. They came From the 54 states, the District of Columbia, PR, The Virgin Island, and Guam for a full schedule of Professional briefings, Army and Air break-out Sessions, and social activities. The speakers included Senator John McCain, Senator Joseph Biden, Secretary of Defense Robert Gates, Army Chief of Staff, GEN George Casey, Air Force Chief Gen Norton Schwartz, and the Commander, US Northern Command, GEN Victor Renuart.

The President of the Enlisted Association, (EANGUS) CSM Frank Lever also addressed the convention. In addition, the commanders of three NG units which had been deployed to Iraq and Afghanistan spoke of their mobilization, and the missions, problems, and successes their units had experienced while activated. Many company grade officers from both Army and Air were in attendance and had ample time to get to know each other and share mutual concerns.

The convention ended on Monday evening with a huge "All States Banquet", with the delegates and their spouses wearing, Mess Dress and Gowns enjoyed fine food and good company. NGAUS speaks for us at the National Level of Government. briefing senators and representatives on National Guard Issues and needs, including concerns of medical support, equipment, deployments, retirements, etc. The EANGUS also adds its voice with NGAUS to ensure our story is told in Washington.

The Military Association of New York (MANY) and The enlisted Association of NY perform the same mission on the state level, as do the military associations of other states. The more members the organizations have the bigger the impact they have when talking to elected officials. There are many voices in Washington and Albany vying for public support and funding. RETIREMENT ANNOUNCED FOR SGM CARL DORNBUSH



After 39 years in the 101st Signal Battalion, Sergeant Major Carl Dornbush retired on September 30th. Over those years he held many different positions ranging from KP to Food Service Sergeant and Private to Sergeant Major. The various assignments brought with them different challenges. One of SGM Dornbush's greatest accomplishments, and fondest memory was having his mess section win the Connely Award in 1987. Hard work and good training lead to the Delta Company Mess section being recognized as having the best field mess operation in New York State. This award still resides in the Orangeburg Armory. "The opportunity to work as a team involved the entire Company" said Dornbush. "Probably the biggest challenge was getting SSG Kolar to cook the army way and not "Rudy's Way." Since entering the Guard in 1969, Sergeant Major Dornbush has seen many changes ranging from uniforms such as the "OD" fatigues that required "Breaking Starch" to the current ACUs. Signal equipment also changed from "Fly Swatter" antennas for the crystal controlled 4 channel TRC 1s to today's satellites and JNNs.
