A Message From The President MG Joseph P. O'Leary (Ret)



On 14 Apr 07 the Liberty Chapter was present at The 129th Annual National Guard Association (NGAUS) was conducted in San Juan, Puerto Rico from 24 thru 27 Aug 07. Over 4,000 service members from Army & Air National Guard, Retirees, and many family members were in attendance. The New York Delegation of 25 also counted members of the Naval Militia and the State Guard in it's numbers. The hospitality mat was out for the National Guard, and our accommodations were first class, and the weather was excellent.

The Delegates were welcomed by the mayor of san Juan, and by the Governor of Puerto Rico; and over the course of the next few days were treated to a variety of timely briefings and a mind boggling display of military hardware and software in the exhibition hall.

Senator John Glenn, and the Chief of Staff of the Army, GEN George Casey, were among those who addressed the convention. All the National Guard company grade officers in attendance spent two hours with GEN Casey in a private give and take session.

LTG Steven Blum, NGB Chief, indicated during his talk that the National Guard is 460,00 strong and over 300,000 of them have served in a warzone, and that 495 of them have been killed in action.

There was plenty of time for social activities, too. The Governor's reception (a feature of every convention) was held in a huge park in San Juan, food, music, and an opportunity to meet members of the National Guard hailing from every state in the union, from Guam, Puerto Rico, Washington and the Virgin Islands.

The dress is civilian clothes, and the atmosphere relaxed. Many states host a hospitality suite in their hotel and invite any an all to visit. The social calendar is capped on the last night of the convention with the "All States Banquet". The pageantry of the state flags on parade and officers from all National Guard organizations is impressive.

The Liberty Chapter fishing trip out of City Island, occurred on 5 Sep 07. Seven hearty souls set sail on the Riptide into the wilds of the Long Island sound. Former King-Fisher LTC George DiSimone was unable to attend due to military duties at FT Hamilton. BG Ferg Foley had his photo taken with a huge fish which could crown a new King-Fisher.


