The 101st Signal Battalion is off to a great start. I am happy to report that the battalion is on its way to meeting the required readiness goals. We now have many of the key leaders in place and new equipment continues to come into the battalion. The battalion personnel strength is growing by the week. We have

shown an increase in strength for every month this year. We are currently at 65% strength and quickly approaching our 75% goal for this fiscal year. This growth is allowing us to move forward on our training program.

The leadership team is coming together nicely. Since the start of the year we have added several key leaders to the unit. The team at the headquarters level is comprised of the Executive Officer, MAJ Tom Kilmartin, the S3, MAJ Kim Farrier and the Command Sergeant Major, CSM Ron Patterson. We also have put in place excellent leaders at the company level. Company A, located in Poughkeepsie is led by CPT Chris Spriegel and First Sergeant, Tracey Krom. Company B located in Yonkers, is led by CPT Henry Wong and First Sergeant Joe Moody, Company C located in Orangeburg, continues to be led by CPT Frank Letizia and 1SG Carl Dornbush. CPT Craig Maceri leads the HHC. We are working hard to fill the remaining leadership positions.

The company commanders are doing an outstanding job with recruiting and retention. Our production and retention rates are among the best in the state. The recruiters that support us are also doing an excellent job. Signal MOSs are selling well. They continue to bring new soldiers to our ranks.

Our troops are real excited about having the whole organization in the state and the new equipment that we have received. Their morale and enthusiasm is off the charts. The added personnel spaces allowed us to promote many soldiers. Soldiers also continue to remark how great the new equipment is and how much they look forward to using it. Its great for my morale to see how much fun they are having coming to drill. This is resulting in a very low loss rate of unit members.

We continue to receive new state of the art equipment. Last summer, we completed a new equipment fielding that provided us with some of the most modern equipment in the Army. We are on the schedule to receive a tactical message switch and 2 commercial data packages later this year. We also picked up all of the equipment from the companies of the 230th Signal Battalion in Tennessee.

Our positive strength numbers are allowing us to move forward on an aggressive training program. My focus for this year was to get most of the required individual training completed so that we can move on to collective training next fiscal year. The battalion NCO corps is doing a great job getting the individual training done. We have had numerous soldiers complete transition training and have now become qualified in their respective Military Occupation Skills (MOS).

Soldiers of the battalion recently completed 2 overseas duty-training (ODT) events. Our soldiers received great training installing CAT 5 and fiber optic cabling in NATO headquarters in Mons, Belgium. Each of the companies had personnel participate in these events. We also had several soldiers participate in a 5th Corps Warfighter in Germany. Our soldiers were involved in the installation of the command and control systems for this exercise.

We are taking advantage of the training that the soldiers received in Europe by getting them involved in cable installation projects in DMNA facilities. We recently completed a CAT 5 installation project in building 82 at Camp Smith. The soldiers that performed the installation did an outstanding job and saved the state thousands of dollars. They also got a chance to exercise the MOS skills. The soldiers loved the event. I expect our soldiers to be involved heavily in the rebuilding of CP Smith.

I am working on building a partnership with the Director of Information Management (DOIM) that will allow many of our other soldiers to get involved with similar projects. Being that our equipment is now commercial compatible, our soldiers now receive much of the same training that the soldiers in the DOIM receive. I am looking for as much work as possible to keep the skills of our soldiers sharp. The DOIM is very receptive to this concept, as it will assist in reducing their workload. The future is exciting for us. We are participating in Grecian Firebolt 2004 this coming June.

We have the Battalion headquarters and 2 company (-) elements participating in the exercise. It will be a challenging event as this will be our first chance to fully employ our new equipment. Our personnel are working hard to ensure that this operation is a success. This week we also had 9 soldiers complete training on a new communications vehicle that is owned by DMNA. This vehicle has communications systems that allow first responders to communicate with each other. Our soldiers have been tasked to operate this equipment in the event of a state emergency or attack.

On a somewhat sad note I must report that I am leaving command of the battalion on 1 April 2004. I am being reassigned as the Chief of Staff, 53d Troop Command. COL Mike Swezey, Commander, 53d Troop Command will name my successor in the next two weeks. Although I am leaving command of the battalion, my new position will continue to allow me to assist in the rebuilding of the 101st Signal Battalion. It has been an honor for me to serve with the many professionals that make up in what I believe is the finest Signal Battalion in the Army.
