A Message From The President MG Joseph P. O'Leary (Ret)



The February 2006 edition of the National Guard magazine carried a feature article entitled "The Wait". It stated, in part, active component personnel can receive retirement pay after they leave the service; so can active guard & reserve (AGR) members. But traditional, partime guard & reserve personnel must wait until age 60 to collect retirement pay.

The National Guard Association (NGAUS) leaders believe the current system is a relic and that Guardsmen, now part of an operational force, not a strategic reserve, have earned an earlier retirement-receipt age.

Congress has passed legislation creating the current Guard & Reserve retirement system (at the urging of NGAUS) in 1948. Our elected legislators who will debate & finally decide this matter are visited by representatives of NGAUS who brief the guard positions and urge favorable consideration.

Retirement pay is just one issue that NGAUS is working. On a regular basis, NGAUS is pushing for medical coverage (TRICARE), for the Guard, equipment replacement and modernization, Guard end strength, insurance benefits, family support, and other important issues that effect the National Guard. NGAUS is our voice in Washington. At the State level the Military Association of NY (MANY) works with NGAUS and state legislators to gain favorable recognition and benefits for military personnel.

The Enlisted Associations, both National & State, add their voices to those of NGAUS and MANY, for the benefit of our military force. Together these professional organizations are working on a daily basis, to strengthen the military forces in our state and nation. There is strength in numbers, these organizations deserve our support and our membership.
