Father Donald Licata Retires

On June 26, 2002, Father (Chaplain) Donald P. Licata was honored at a retirement dinner culminating 25 years of service in the NYS Department of Corrections. During his career with the prison system, Father served as Associate Chaplain and then Chaplain at the Fishkill, Down State, and Beacon Correctional Facilities.

Father Licata also was New York's "Signal Corps" Chaplain. His military career spans over 27 years. He was a member of the USAR from 1961 to 1964. In 1965 he joined the 101st Signal Battalion, where he served as Battalion Chaplain until 1978. From 1979 to 1986 he was the Chaplain for the

187th Signal Group. In 1986, Father was assigned to the 42nd Infantry Division as Assistant Division Chaplain. He retired from military service in 1989 with the rank of Colonel. Among Father Licata's military awards are: Meritorious Service Medal (2 awards), Army Commendation Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Meritorious Award for Humanitarian Service (2 awards), the Honorable Order of St. Barbara, and the New York State Twenty Year Long and Faithful Service Medal.

Farther Licata holds a B.A. and an M..A. degree from the Archdiocese of New York. (St. Joseph's Seminary in Yonkers). He also earned his M.E. Degree from Fordham University. The "Signal Community" wishes Father Licata a long, healthy, and enjoyable retirement.
