Since 1878 National Guard Officers from every state & territory have gathered once a year to share information and establish legislative priorities. The 128th NGAUS General conference and exhibition was conducted in Alburquerque, NM from 15 Sep thru 18 Sep 2006. Officers & families, came from every state, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rice, the Virgin Islands and Guam (Over 4,500 total).

Thirty eight representatives from New York (Including two from the Liberty Chapter) made the trip. The attendees were treated to informative briefings, brought up to date on pressing National Guard issues, and had access to a huge exhibition hall displaying the latest military products and services.

LTG Steven Blum, Chief of the National Guard, addressed the conference and praised the Guard for it's activities at home and abroad. He pointed out that the Guard is essential to homeland defense & security, disaster response, and the war fight with the Army & Air Force overseas; and as such the Guard has to be resourced, equipped, and paid entitlement packages they have earned.

LTG Honore, First Army Commander, addressed equipment shortages in National Guard and active duty units and the problems training without full TO&E equipment. Home Land Security secretary Michael Chertoff praised the National Guard for unprecedented accomplishments since 9/11, and noted that the Guard is a key player in our military operations at home and abroad.

Break out sessions for army and air representatives, company grade officers, warrant's and retired personnel were also available. In addition to military matters there was a full plate of social activities capped by the "All States" banquet on the last night of the conference. NGAUS, and it's counter part in NY (MANY) are organizations which keep National Guard needs and concerns in the forefront with federal & state legislators. They deserve our support.
